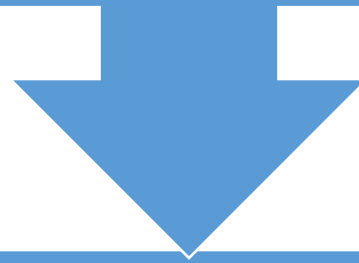

This course aims to teach realistic and functional English through a wide range of materials, including reading passages, listening exercises, and student interaction by enhancing language skills and vocabulary knowledge.

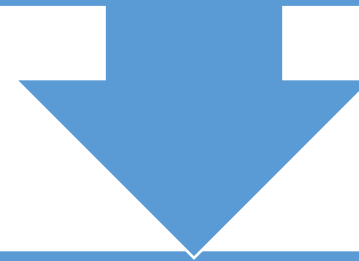

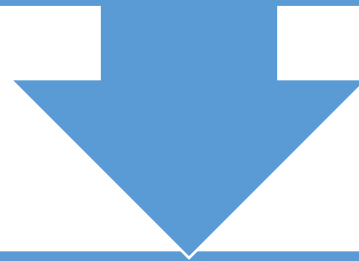

# ASSESSMENT
